DESCRIPTIONS

Gibson Golden Delicious Apple: Produces yellow fruit with a sweet crisp flavor. Ripens in late September. A good pollinator for other apple varieties.

Honeycrisp Apple: Blushed scarlet over a yellow background. Creamy white flesh that breaks apart easily. Juicy, sweet and crisp.

Bartlett Pear: Smooth, firm texture and juicy, spicy taste. Harvest late August. Needs pollinator.

Olympic/Korean Giant Pear: Produces large, sweet, crisp, juicy light brown Asian pears. Ripens early October. Needs pollinator.

MD Redskin Peach: Firm, juicy texture with sweet, tangy taste. Good for canning, baking or eating fresh. Descendent of Redhaven and Elberta Peach.

Redhaven Peach: An almost fuzzless skin over firm, creamy yellow flesh. Heavy-bearing and cold-hardy.

Bounty Peach: Large, round yellow flesh. Freestone. Excellent for fresh eating and/or canning.

Bubblegum Plum: Japanese variety. A heavy producing tree yields crops of medium-to-large sweet plums. Fruit has reddish-bronze skin and juicy, yellow flesh. Needs pollinator.

Satsuma Plum: Japanese variety. Large plum with dark, solid red skin and flesh. Firm, juicy and sweet flavor. Great for fresh eating, cooking, canning or preserves. Needs pollinator.

Montmorency Sour Cherry: Self-fruitful. Medium sized fruit with tangy taste. Great for pies and cobblers. Ripens in June.

English Walnut: Large compound leaves with handsome branching makes an attractive yard tree. Although self-pollinating, trees bear earlier and larger crops when two trees are planted.

Flowering Red Centurian Crabapple: Beautiful, single, delicate pink flowers in spring. Foliage is deep purple and the tree has an upright spreading habit 10 – 20' tall. Disease resistant.

Tree Tag: Aluminum, weatherproof tags with wires feature a brown cardboard backing for easy embossing with a pencil or ballpoint pen.

Wildflower Mix of 34 northeast hardy annuals and perennials to provide years of bloom to attract a variety of birds, butterflies and pollinators. Includes: Asters, Coneflower, Black-eyed Susan, cosmos, Daisy, Coreopsis, Poppy and many more.

Deer problems? Milorganite is a useful tool in repelling deer from grazing on fruit trees and ornamental plantings. The odor of Milorganite (an organic nitrogen fertilizer) keeps deer away. Hang a small bag in each tree, or spread around plantings to deter deer.
